An informative and interactive talk delivered by Dr Srilakshmi G V, highlighting the uses, identification, and benefits of common medicinal plants such as Tulsi, Brahmi, Aloe vera, Lemongrass, Neem etc. Students were introduced to the concept of traditional herbal healing systems and how these plants contribute to health, immunity, and sustainable living. Emphasis was placed on the need to preserve indigenous plant knowledge and integrate it into everyday life.


Fig 1: Dr Srilakshmi G V Delivering speech at Morarji Desai residential School, Macchina, Belthangady.
